

Oxalis triangularis

How to save and store your Oxalis corms.



At the sign of your Oxalis going green and limped over after the first frost, remove the entire plant from the ground and rinse off all the soil from the corms using a garden hose.



Remove and discard the large grey corm from the smaller orange/pink corm. Remove all the small orange/pink corms from their stems. Place these corms on paper until completely dry. After dry, place the corms in a container filled with dry vermiculite or dry peat moss and cover completely. A cardboard box works well as a container. Do not put a lid on the container. Store in a cool, dry, dark room until the first week of May when the corms can be planted at a depth of 3 inches.
